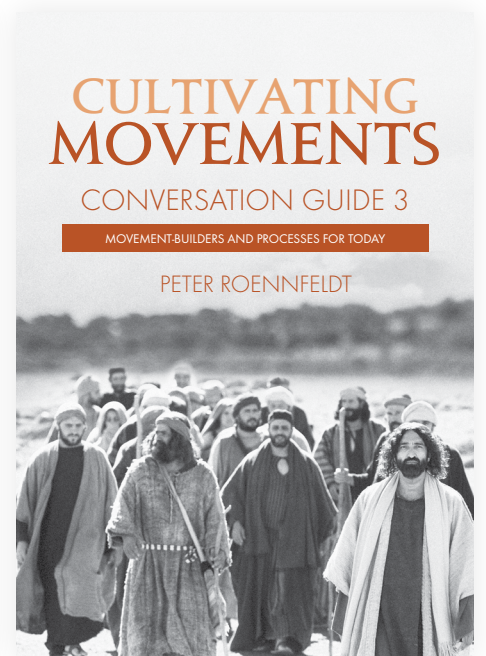
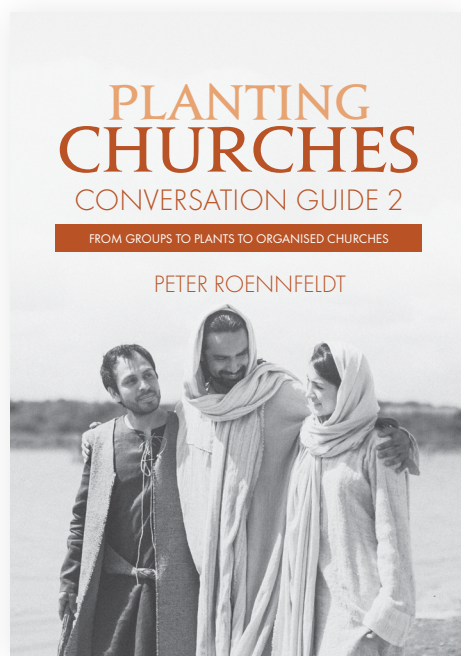
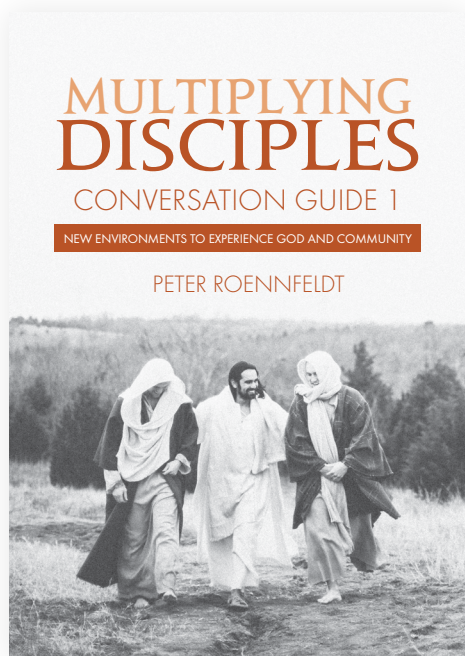

Evangelism has become so complicated most feel they cannot do it, but Jesus modelled, taught and commissioned a process that you will enjoy. Disciple making is for everyone.

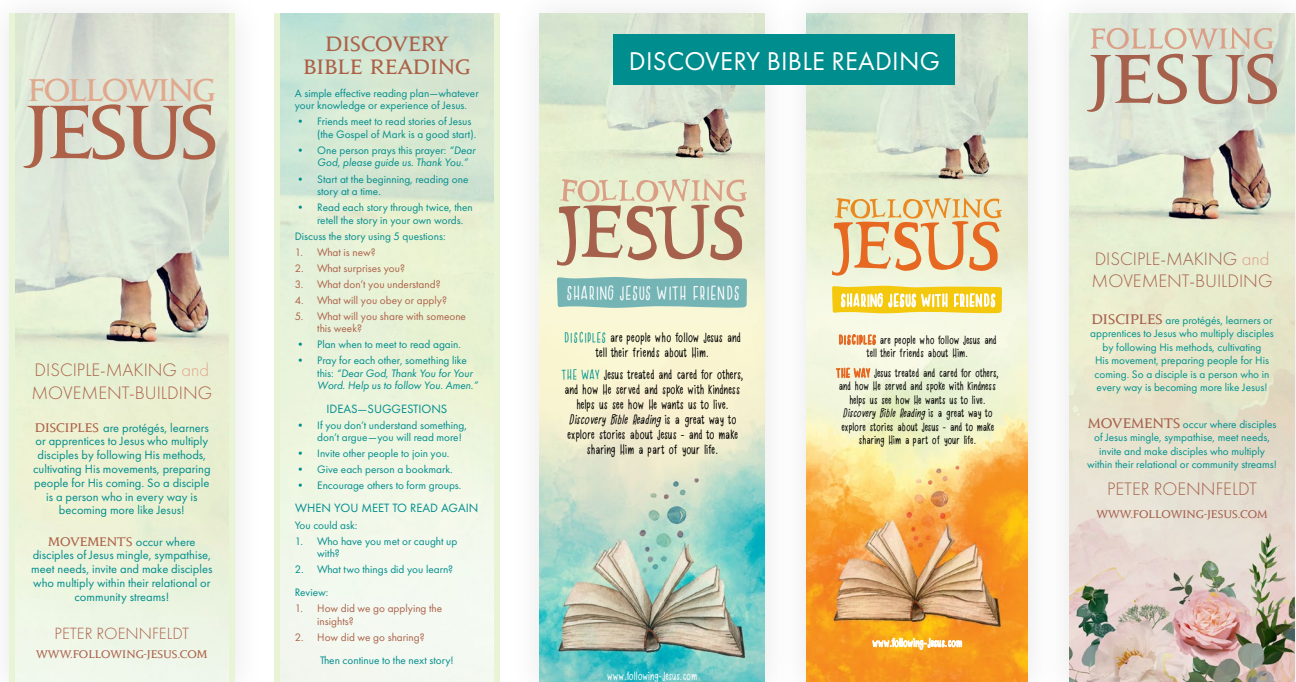
KEY RESOURCES for the 3 phases of this equipping journey.

For each of the 3 phases (1) multiplying disciples, (2) planting churches and (3) cultivating movements—there is a *Conversation Guide*, bookmarks, books, and short videos to support and inspire you in following Jesus' method.

DISCOVERY BIBLE READING groups is the essential platform for equipping and sharing faith. Jesus taught 3 simple steps to take us from contact to sharing (Luke 10:8, 9)—

- (1) Eat people's food—and listen to their stories.
- (2) Heal them—and share your story.
- (3) Tell them God's story.

Telling God's story gives the opportunity to introduce **Discovery Bible Reading**—for your family members, friends or work associates to get to know and experience what God is like.



Discovery Bible Reading is a simple effective reading plan whatever your knowledge or experience of Jesus or the Bible.

- **Bookmarks.** On each bookmark is an outline of how to do it—to share with friends. They are available in a **variety of styles** and **multiple languages**. Download **FREE** from www.following-Jesus.com
- **Discover Jesus.** This is a great give-away “starter Bible” for friends who have never seen or read a Bible. It is a compilation of the gospels of Mark and John, with the New Testament book of Acts—in an easy-to-read translation:

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest, simplest introduction to Jesus—which can be read in a few weeks, using the *Discovery Bible Reading* process.

The Gospel of John explores all fundamental teachings of Christian faith—as you and your friends get to know Jesus.

In Acts your friends will experience the activities of the early followers of Jesus—and be inspired by the Spirit and Jesus’ idea of church.


As you start the training, form small teams or breakout groups to work together, and put the training into practice.





FOLLOWING JESUS
DISCIPLE-MAKING and MOVEMENT-BUILDING
DISCIPLES are protégés, learners or apprentices to Jesus who multiply disciples by following His methods, cultivating His movements, preparing people for His coming. So a disciple is a person who in every way is becoming more like Jesus!
MOVEMENTS occur where disciples of Jesus mingle, sympathise, meet needs, invite and make disciples who multiply within their relational or community streams!

DISCOVERY BIBLE READING
A simple effective reading plan—whatever your knowledge or experience of Jesus.
• Friends meet to read stories of Jesus (the Gospel of Mark is a good start).
• One person prays this prayer: “Dear God, please guide us. Thank You.”
• Start at the beginning, reading one story at a time.
• Read each story through twice, then retell the story in your own words.
Discuss the story using 5 questions:
1. What is new?
2. What surprises you?
3. What don’t you understand?
4. What will you obey or apply?
5. What will you share with someone this week?
• Plan when to meet to read again.
• Pray for each other, something like this: “Dear God, Thank You for Your Word. Help us to follow You. Amen.”
IDEAS—SUGGESTIONS
• If you don’t understand something, don’t argue—you will read more!
• Invite other people to join you.
• Give each person a bookmark.
• Encourage others to form groups.
WHEN YOU MEET TO READ AGAIN
You could ask:
1. Who have you met or caught up with?
2. What two things did you learn?
Review:
1. How did we go applying the insights?
2. How did we go sharing?
Then continue to the next story!

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

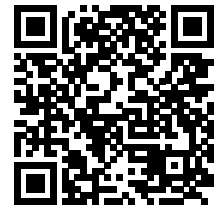

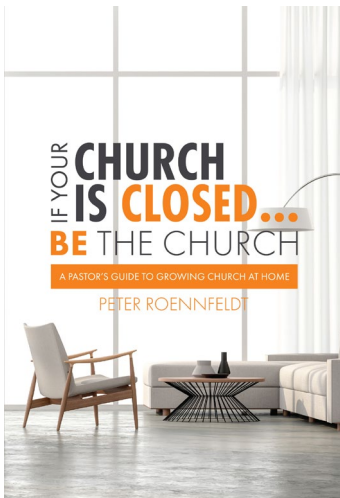
